Just like that, another year has skated by — and what a fantastic year it's been for our club! Our membership remains strong, with approximately 585 members participating this season — a new record for our club! This number consistently hovers around 500 year after year. A huge thank you goes out to Alma and Nancy in the office, who work tirelessly behind the scenes to keep everything running smoothly for our skaters.

Every season, I continue to be inspired by the dedication and passion of our skaters, coaches, and volunteers. This year was no exception. We are fortunate to have an incredible board that gets things done, making my role as president an absolute pleasure.

Building on last year's successful transition from CIBC to BMO, we fully embraced the use of the Square for processing payments. During our ice show, we were even able to add three mobile units — a move that proved both efficient and highly successful. It's remarkable to look back just a few years and see how far we've come: from plastic baggies full of cash to accepting etransfers and credit card payments. A big step forward in modernizing how we operate! Our lottery license was again successful this season, running 50/50 and club draws. But what truly stood out — and what I see as another big win for the year — was the creation of our very own promotional lottery fundraiser. In previous years, we participated in Skate Ontario's program, which brought in limited funds and saw very few local winners. Again this season, our board took the initiative to design and run our own fundraiser. With prizes ranging from gift cards and Moir's skate sharpening to iPads, game systems, and next season's memberships, all the winnings stayed within our club community. This initiative raised approximately \$16,000 — a \$6,000 increase over last year's campaign — and those funds will directly benefit our members.

One thing I really enjoyed seeing this year was the use of our harness system, which was purchased last year. I look forward to seeing it out again next season. I know it is a great teaching tool and the kids love it!

In terms of communication, this was the first year to send out a club survey to all our skaters. We want to use the past as a springboard and not as a hammock, so the results of this survey will help guide us for the 2025-2026 season. If you have not filled it out yet, please do that! I want to make a special mention about our social media. Martha has done an incredible job finding creative ways to get our messages out to our members and the general public. I just love all our creative posts. This was a huge highlight of this year.

Our annual ice show was another highlight of the year — a truly magical event once again. Thank you to everyone involved, especially our skaters, coaching staff, and the many volunteers who brought it all to life. It was one of our most successful shows, and I look forward to hearing that report.



If there's one consistent theme each season, it's the incredible spirit of volunteerism. Whether it was our ice show, board initiatives, or events like our golf day — this club runs on the passion and commitment of its volunteers. Our golf day for example had a huge number of donations this year, the most since the Scott and Tessa themed golf day 10 years ago.

I'm incredibly proud to be part of such a dynamic, high-functioning club — one built on teamwork, vision, and a shared love of skating. It's a privilege to serve alongside people who want nothing more than to see our skaters and our club succeed.

Here's to another great year ahead!

My 2024-2025 recommendations were:

- That the president remains in an active role with the synchro program, to assist where needed. I am pleased to have been more involved in these programs, and I hope to attend their regular meetings. We have a strong synchro program in our club, and it is amazing to see it flourish. It just keeps getting better and better.
- To continue to support our coaches by offering continuing development courses. We have started to do that, and we look forward to doing this more.
- To continue to look for ways to top up our bursary account. The golf day was an incredible fundraiser this year!
- To continue to utilize our lotto license to the fullest

Moving towards the 2025-2026 season, I will keep these recommendations moving forward, and will take information from our club survey, and build off those results.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your President and I look forward to another great year.

1/ ICE ALLOCATION and SCHEDULING:

- Developed winter schedule with help of our Professional coaches. Able to add 2 hours of ice on Saturday mornings at Komoka
- Managed cancellations/extra practices for Club throughout the year.
- 2025-26 September & Winter Ice allocation request have been submitted for both City of London and Middlesex Centre.
- Parent/Skater survey sent out to membership in the Spring for input on what we do well and what we can
 improve.

2/ 2024-25 ISC Lottery Draw:

Continued to run our own ISC Lottery draw
 a/ 11,495 tickets issued out of 11,500 printed
 b/ all prizes were won by people affiliated with our club
 c/ a profit of almost \$17,000 to go towards the operation of our club and helping to keep our fees affordable which makes our programs accessible to more. This profit was an approx.\$1000 more then last year.

3/ PROGRAMS:

CanSKATE

• Ran 2 – 10 week sessions FALL CanSKATE (Oct-Dec) and WINTER CanSKATE(Jan-Mar) sessions at each arena

Medway – CanSKATE A/B combined / PreCAN with PreHockey Ilderton – CanSKATE B / CanSKATE A/ PreCAN with PreHockey Komoka – CanSKATE B / CanSKATE A / PreCAN with PreHockey / Parent & Tot

- Increased maximum number on ice to 48 so a third professional coach was needed for each session
- Information table set up at sessions again this year
- Three Christmas Family Skates held at Ilderton & Medway arenas
- Two new CanSKATE coaches hired for Komoka arena
- **NEW this year **due to numbers on IntroSTAR, implemented a FastTrack CanSKATE program which moved 7 skaters working on STAGE 4/5 off of CanSKATE B to the Intro Session. They continued to work on their Stage levels while starting some to the IntroSTAR tests as well

IntroSTARSkate

- Ran a 6-month session only October-March
- New this year ran a Komoka IntroSTAR on Saturdays. Previously this was offered on Sundays prior to CanSKATE but last year we had to cancel due to low numbers.
- All IntroSTAR sessions had lower numbers then previous years but this was expected with the big turn over into our JuniorSTAR sessions

- Option of 7 month or 6-month registration offered again this year. Sept-March or Oct.-March
- December & March High test days were offered. Low test results were also registered with Skate Canada once Coaches handed in results end of the winter.
- Jumping Harness trained Leo Baeten (Senior dancer from IAM) and was able to offer some harness lessons to our skaters. This is ongoing as we will look to train more so to be have harness more available to our skaters
- Included a 'Dance' only group lesson format day one morning/week in Winter and carried this on in the Spring session

ADULT STARSKate

- Ran a 2 10-week Adult STARSkate session at Medway Arena on Friday nights again for this year.
- FALL program had 17 registered / WINTER had 11 registered. More then last year for FALL but less for WINTER.

- PA Training Day in October. A lot of new, young but enthusiastic skaters to help with our CanSKATE programs.
- Approximately 10 15 PA's used per arena.

Overview:

The 2025 Ice Show was a great success, with this year's theme, *Wicked*, bringing creativity and excitement to the rink. Audiences responded positively, and we were proud to showcase the talent and hard work of our skaters, coaches, and volunteers. Thank you to everyone who made the show possible.

Financial Summary:

- **Total Profit:** \$4,460.41
- Outstanding Expenses: Coaches' fees still need to be deducted from the profit.
- Costume Funding: The donation from Kathy Bleak specifically for costumes has been fully used.

Recommendations:

1. Costume Budget for 2026:

We recommend that \$2,000 be set aside for next year's costume costs. This amount could be allocated from **club lottery funds** to ensure we continue to provide quality costumes without relying solely on donations.

2. Theme Selection Deadline:

Selecting the Ice Show theme by **Christmas 2025** is recommended. This allows time for music selection, choreography planning, and early volunteer coordination.

3. Costume Planning Timeline:

The biggest feedback we received this year was from the costume volunteers, who felt they did not have enough time to plan and prepare. To address this:

- CanSkate and Intro Star number ideas should be shared with costume coordinators by February 15th so they can begin reviewing existing costume bins and pulling potential items early.
- Final songs and program choreography should be confirmed no later than March 1st to allow ample time for costume creation and adjustments.



Conclusion:

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all the volunteers, coaches, and families who made the 2025 Ice Show such a success. With a few adjustments to our timelines, we can improve the experience even further next year. These changes aim to reduce stress, support our volunteers, and ensure another memorable show in 2026.

During the 2024/2025 season I served in the third year of my term as Marketing and Public Relations Chair.

Our fall club spirit wear store opened on November 4th and ran for two weeks. We worked with the same vendor and offered a variety of clothing and swag items and even added in a few new products. We promoted the store by posting it on social media, the club website, emailing the link to families and handing out paper flyers during CanSkate and StarSkate sessions. The fall store did a total of \$2904.10 in sales which gave the club a rebate of \$383.03.

A new product we introduced this year was a spirit scarf which we had custom made for skaters and families to wear while cheering on their athlete. We used the same vendor as the club store and purchased the minimum quantity of 100 scarves. The total cost for the scarves (including freight and tax) was \$3344.26. We decided to set the selling price at \$40 for 1 or \$75 for 2. We advertised on our social media accounts and then pushed sales during the weeks of Jan 20-26th at CanSkate, Intro and Star Skate sessions. We also sold them at various other times throughout the season, including the year end Ice Show. As of 28 April 25 we have sold a total of 50 scarves.

During next season we will continue to run the club store in the Fall (Oct/Nov) with the hopes of adding in more new products. We will also continue with scarf sales before the fall/winter competition season starts.

Lastly, I continued to work on designing new roll up banners for the lobbies at all three arenas. This has been a long and slow project but one I want to ensure is completed properly with thought into the layout and choice of photos to ensure all areas of the club are captured and represented appropriately. I will continue to work on this and seek feedback from the board as we proceed forward.

Thank you to everyone on the board and to all the skaters and families for making this another wonderful season. I have thoroughly enjoyed being a part of all the club activities and look forward to next year!

This is the second year that Ilderton Skating Club hosted its in-house lottery. We sold 11,495 tickets to our members at \$2 for each ticket. The lottery brought us a total revenue of \$22,990 and a profit of \$16,844.73. Compared with the numbers last year (revenue \$21,600, profit \$15,892.97), we have around 6% growth in both revenue and profit. Our lottery profit margin is around 73%.
