- High test days were offered and results registered with Skate Canada. Low test results were also registered with Skate Canada once Coaches handed in results end of the winter.
- Jumping Harness –not available this year due to lack of trained people. In the process of training & hiring for the new season as Coaches have targeted this as necessity.
- Had 2 young Coaches on the sessions being mentored by our seasoned Coaches. Hoping that they can continue this year and be a great asset to our club.

ADULT STARSKate

- Ran a 2 - 10-week Adult STARSKate session at Medway Arena on Friday nights again for this year.
- FALL program had 17 registered / WINTER had 11 registered. More than last year for FALL but less for WINTER.

Overview

The 2026 Ice Show was a monumental success. This year’s theme, **"A Wonka Journey,"** brought a world of pure imagination to the rink, showcasing the incredible talent and dedication of our skaters, coaches, and volunteers. We are grateful to the community for their continued support in making this production a highlight of the season.

Financial Summary

- **Total Revenue:** \$27,419.78
- **Total Expenses:** \$35,426.88
- **Net Position:** -\$8,007.10 (Note: This figure reflects comprehensive accounting including all ice rentals and facilities which may vary from previous reporting methods).
- **Outstanding Expenses:** Coaches' fees still need to be deducted from the final totals.

Sponsorship Highlights

We saw strong community support this year with \$2,562.63 in sponsorships. Key contributors included:

Recommendations & Observations

- **Ice & Facility Costs:** The 2026 expenses show a significant increase in ice rental (\$14,107.16) and setup (\$946.17) compared to previous estimates. Future budgets should account for these comprehensive costs early.
- **Costume Management:** Continuing the 2025 recommendation, we utilized specific funding for costumes. For 2027, we suggest setting a budget of \$1500- \$2,000 to ensure volunteer stress remains low.
- **Holiday Scheduling (Easter):** Due to the board moving the show back one week for Easter, the setup process was significantly easier than in previous years. We recommend evaluating the cost annually to maintain this improved setup workflow.

Conclusion

The 2026 "A Wonka Journey" Ice Show was a success in terms of production quality and community engagement. While expenses were higher due to more inclusive facility reporting, our revenue continues to grow year-over-year. Thank you to all the volunteers and families who contributed to this magical event.

During the 2025/2026 season I served in the fourth year of my term as Marketing and Public Relations director.

We kicked off the season by entering a “Wicked” themed club float into the, always well attended, Ilderton Fall Fair parade. This was a fun way for our skaters to participate in sharing our club with the community and getting the ISC name out in a way that puts faces to names and brings joy to all ages. To top it all off, we brought home 1st place in our category!

Our annual club spirit wear store opened on November 19th and ran for two weeks. We worked with the same vendor, Eclipse Promotions, and offered a variety of clothing and swag items.
